RANGE RULES & REGULATIONS

Indoor Range Rules

1. Only regulation paper targets are allowed to be used on the range. The Range Officers reserve the right to prohibit targets that are deemed to be offensive or unsafe. Use the appropriately-sized target that is placed at eye level to ensure that the bullets will enter the bullet trap. Rifle and shotgun shooters must use a large silhouette targets.
2. Any firearms that are uncased behind the firing line must be unloaded, have the actions or cylinders open, and their safety mechanisms engaged.
3. Only load your firearm when you are on the firing line, keeping the muzzle pointed downrange at all times.
4. No handgun drawing from a holster is allowed without the prior approval of the Range Officer.
5. If you have a malfunction or a jam that you cannot clear, lay the firearm on the bench while keeping the muzzle pointed downrange, and ask the Range Officer for assistance. Never remove a jammed or malfunctioning firearm from the range without prior approval from the Range Officer.
6. When you finish shooting, unload and re-case your firearm before leaving the shooting position. Pick up only your own brass that is behind the firing line, and please place your trash in the receptacle.
7. Never extend any part of your body forward of the firing line for any reason.

Outdoor Range Rules

1. Always keep the action of your gun OPEN when walking to the range and in between the shooting stations. Only move with an unloaded gun with the action open.
2. Eye and ear protection must be worn at all times on the outdoor ranges.
3. Never shoot on a field when an orange cone is on top of the trap house or when a skeet house door is open.
4. Do not load your gun until it is your turn to shoot. Unload immediately if a Range Officer tells you to do so or if you or another shooter has a malfunction.
5. Make certain that you are loading the proper ammunition. No ammunition faster than 1290 fps with 1-1/8 ounces of 7-1/2 shot is permitted. Also, do not mix ammunition in your pockets or shell bag.
6. Only load ONE (1) shell at a time on the trap field. You may load two shells only when on the skeet or 5-stand fields, or when shooting trap doubles. Any exceptions must be cleared with the Range Officer prior to shooting.
7. Keep the muzzle pointed in the air or downrange at all times. Never sweep the muzzle to the right or left toward other shooters.
8. Always place firearms in the gun racks when not shooting. Never lay your gun on the ground or put the muzzle in the grass or dirt.
9. You are not allowed to pass a gun to another person while on the firing line. If you are sharing a gun, then each shooter must shoot his complete round of trap or skeet and then pass the unloaded gun to the next person.
10. Follow the Range Officer's directions immediately. Arguing or unsportsmanlike behavior will cause you to be removed from the range and denied future shooting privileges.
